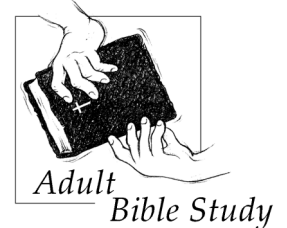
August 22nd worship @ 10:30

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the next several weeks, we will encounter a Jesus who really does not mind getting into trouble with the religious authorities of his day. As the Gospel according to Luke presents it, Jesus almost revels in riling the opposition. It seems he wants to get their goat.



Wishing to get someone's goat is nothing new. Depending on the network you listen to or watch, stirring another person's pot has become an art form. As we see this practiced today, however, there is little respect for the other. The object of much of this conversation is not to honestly converse, but to win the argument, no matter what.

Because this is what we are used to, it is easy to assume Jesus is engaging in the same kind of conversation with his "adversaries". Nothing could be further from the truth, however. In Jesus' day, back and forth, point and counter-point were accepted ways of exploring the fine points of the law. If you pushed your "opponent", it was to get them to think. If they pushed you, the same was true.

When Jesus is encountered by those who hope to trap him, they are putting him to the test. They want to see what he will say or do. Time after time, these characters approach Jesus with two choices. Time after time, Jesus does or says something that leaves *them* stumped, not sure what to say or do. Be warned! Jesus always comes up with another way of looking at the test.

So the parable of the good Samaritan ends, not with a question which Jesus must answer, but with a question his listeners must answer. Who was the neighbor to the injured man?

Our Gospel lessons are about to take us into the land of healing on the Sabbath. Those who question Jesus about this *are sure* that it is against the law to heal on the Sabbath. That Jesus *does* heal on the Sabbath is an offense to God and to everything holy. Except Jesus poses a question, one which leaves his accusers with nothing to say. In the repartee that takes place between these students of the law, Jesus seems to make a point which cannot be refuted.
