Passion/Palm Sunday April 1

Passion Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week and concludes on Easter. Waving palm branches is a symbol of victory over one's enemies. May our palm speak of the victory we have through Christ the King.

Maundy Thursday Service April 5 at 7:00 P.M.

Maundy Thursday, also known as Holy Thursday, is the day Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper. This is a candle-light communion service. This service is held in the Fellowship Hall. We do it with a very special service, a service of Scripture readings, songs, and sacrament. There is no preaching.
