Jesus referred to his body as a temple when he was challenged about driving the vendors and money changers out of the Jerusalem temple. The temple in Jerusalem was a thing of rare beauty, its stunning marble pavements, its terraced courts, and its rich adornment, made it one of the striking spectacles under the sun. In God's eyes, the human body, designed and built by the hand of the almighty, is a thing of divine genius. We read in the Book of Psalms, I am fearfully and wonderfully made (Psalm 139:14). Someone said, consider those ivory pillars of bone; those alabaster walls of flesh; that many-toned organ of speech; those long corridors of brain and nerve, through which thought and emotion move; those storied archives where memory resides as the custodian of the records of the past: and tell me if you do not see an exquisite beauty and delicacy in the Lord's comparison, as he spake of the temple of his body. Our Lord reinstated the body to its rightful place as the temple of God. St. Paul tells us these bodies should be presented to God as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God (Romans 12:1). It should not escape us that Jesus referred to his body as temple in the context of cleansing the temple of those who misused it. But the story in John 2 is not so much about the cleansing of the house of worship as much as it is about the cleansing of our bodies, the true temple of God.
